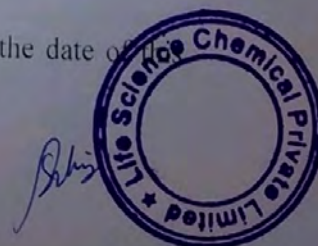


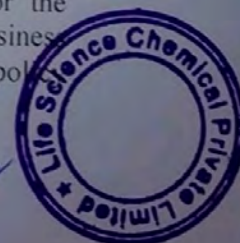

Independent Auditor's Report
To the Life Science Chemical Private Limited
Report on audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Life Science Chemical Private Limited ("the Company") which comprises the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2024, the Statement of Profit and Loss, and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.

- In our opinion, the aforesaid financial statements comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act.
- On the basis of the written representations received from the directors as on 31st March, 2024 taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors is disqualified as on 31st March, 2024 from being appointed as a director in terms of Section 164 (2) of the Act.

Corporate Information

a. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

Although these estimates are based on the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustments to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

c. Accounting Convention

The company follows the mercantile system of accounting, recognizing income and expenditure on accrual basis. The accounts are prepared on historical cost basis and as a going concern. Accounting policies not referred to specifically otherwise, are consistent with the generally accepted accounting principles. All the amounts disclosed in the financial statements and notes are presented in Indian rupees have been rounded off to the nearest lakhs as per the requirement of Schedule III to the Act, unless otherwise stated. The amount '0.00' denotes amount less tha Rupees Five Hundred.

d. Revenue Recognition

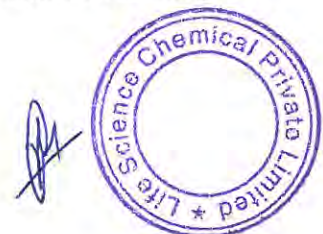
Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured

ii. Income from Services:

Revenue from services is recognized when services have been rendered and there should be no uncertainty regarding consideration and its ultimate collection, , net of discounts to customers excluding taxes or duties collected on behalf of the government.



iii **Interest Income :**

Revenue is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.

e **Property, Plant & Equipments**

There is no property , plant & equipments in the company.

f **Employee Benefits**

There is no employee in the company.

g **Foreign Currency Transactions**

- i. Initial Recognition: Foreign currency transaction, are recorded in the reporting Currency, by applying the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.
- ii. Conversion: Foreign currency monetary items are reported using the closing rate.
- iii. Exchange Difference: Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items at rates different from those at which they are initially recorded during the year or reported in previous financial statement are recognized as income or as expenses at the end of year by applying closing rate.

h **Borrowing Costs**

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets till such time the asset is ready for its intended use. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for intended use. Costs incurred in raising funds are amortized equally over the period for which the funds are acquired. All other borrowing costs are charged to profit and loss account.

i **Cash Flow Statement**

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of a non- cash nature, any deferrals or accruals of past or future operating cash receipts or payments and item of income or expenses associated with investing or financing cash flows. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities are segregated.

j **Taxation**

The accounting treatment for the Income Tax in respect of the Company's income is based on the Accounting Standard on 'Accounting for Taxes on Income' (AS-22). The provision made for Income Tax in Accounts comprises both, the current tax and deferred tax. Provision for Current Tax is made on the assessable Income Tax rate applicable to the relevant assessment year after considering various deductions available under the Income Tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax is recognized for all timing differences; being the differences between the taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Such deferred tax is quantified using the tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted as on the Balance Sheet date. The carrying amount of deferred tax asset/ liability is reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and consequential adjustments are carried out.

k **Investments :**

There is no investment in the company

l **Inventories :**

There is no inventory in the company.



m Provisions, contingent Liabilities and contingent assets:

A provision is recognized if, as a result of a past event, the Company has a present legal obligation that is reasonably estimable, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are determined by the best estimate of the likely future outflow of economic benefits required to settle the obligation at the reporting date. Where no reliable estimate can be made, a disclosure is made as contingent liability. A disclosure for a contingent liability is also made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. Where there is a possible obligation or a present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

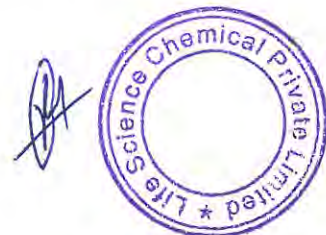

p Earning Per Share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the net profit after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and also the weighted average number of equity shares that could have been issued upon conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares. The diluted potential equity shares are adjusted for the proceeds receivable had the shares been actually issued at fair value which is the average market value of the outstanding shares. Dilutive potential equity shares are deemed converted as of the beginning of the period, unless issued at a later date. Dilutive potential equity shares are determined independently for each period presented. In case of bonus issue the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period and for all periods presented should be adjusted for events, other than the conversion of potential equity shares, that have changed the number of equity shares outstanding, without a corresponding change in resources.

q Impairment of Assets

An asset is treated as impaired when carrying cost of assets exceeds its recoverable value. An impairment loss is charged off to profit and loss account as and when asset is identified for impairment. 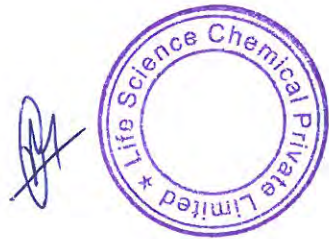

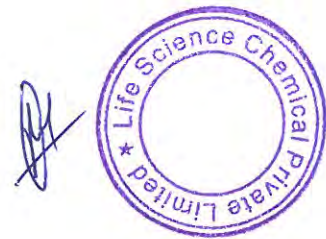

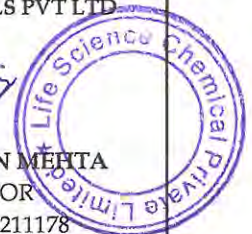
